April 11, 2019 Minutes of the Governing Board/SAC/Founding Board Meeting

- 4. Open Public Meetings Act Statement The meeting has been properly noticed.
- 5. Public Presentation: Alley McInnis gave a report on the SkillsUSA State Competition in Pensacola. He said that they took 47 students to the event, saying that practically every academy participated. There were 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in just about every one of our academies. Mr. McInnis wished the instructors from every academy were present, because they are the ones who are the real heroes. This school was built on the foundation of vocational education; then we went to technical and now we are in the career academies, which SouthTech is the best. The ESE kids also did well and came in 3rd place. Mr. McInnis said he received a letter from the hotel and they said they would love to have us come back again, because of how well the kids behaved. The teachers also get credit for this, because they make sure that the kids are doing what they are supposed to do, so they get up at five o'clock in the morning and do not go to bed sometimes until 11 or 12 o'clock at night. Mr. McInnis told of how strenuous it was for both instructors and students with the hectic schedule. The kids came back showing their medals and when the other students saw their medals, they were encouraged to go to participate in Skills next year. Mr. McInnis relayed stories about how overwhelmed with emotion one of the kids was who won 1st place in the motorcycle contest. He said that there were more success stories, one after another. We have ten students who will be going to the National Competition in Louisville, Kentucky. Unfortunately, there is no contest for the Hair Weave category, so that students will not be able to go. SouthTech always wins the State contest in Hair Weave, but there is still not a national contest for it, because they have to have at least ten states competing in that category. There was a new rule this year that you had to get 70% of the score, and if you did not receive 70% of the score, even if you won 1st place, you could not go to nationals. He was really close. The good news is that he is a Junior, so he still has another chance next year. All the other students got 80-90% on the score. Mr. McInnis told other stories about the other student victories and said that all of the nursing students, including Basic Health and Practical Nursing won 1st, and we had a winner for the first time for First Aid, the Valedictorian of the graduating class, Loncey Elie. All of the programs that the students competed in and won is just a biopsy of this school, and it is the best. Mr. McInnis said that Mr. Wiglesworth did a fantastic job and he knew that once he got into it, he would be a lifer. He asked him to say a few words. Mr. Wigelsworth said yes, we did have 27 students who placed, but he wanted to put the numbers aside, because they do not always tell the whole story all the time. Mr. Wiglesworth said some kids need a push, some need encouragement, and some need what we unfortunately, cannot give them. When they called the name of the student Mr. McInnis talked about, he did not smile, he did not show any enthusiasm, but just sat there for a minute, went down to get his medal, and when he returned, he just collapsed in Mr. Terry's arms. He told Mr. Terry that he had told him that he would not let him down. So his main thing was that he did not want to let Mr. Terry down. Mr. Wiglesworth said since he is not teaching right now, he had forgotten what that looked like, but to see it first hand, it made everything worth it. That kid had never really experience success, but cared more about what his teacher thought than winning the medal. It made the trip worth it. We quoted him for our newsletter coming out tomorrow, and he is walking with a pep in his step today, wearing a shirt that says "Got Skills?" Mr. Wiglesworth said seeing that gives him a reason to come to school for the rest of the year.

- 7. *Treasurer's/Financial Report:* Mr. Heller reported that the STA/STPA Finance Committee met prior to the Board meeting and they recommended approval for STA Items C-1 through C-4 and STPA Items PC-1 through PC-4 and for STSC Item SCC-1.
- 8A. Superintendent's Report:

STA-STPA-STSC Charters: Mr. Kidd reported that a year and six days after the renewal for Prep and application for the Success Center were approved by the Board, these charters were approved by the School

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Board. The STA charter is still a work in progress and the District requested that we give them an extension. Mr. Kidd has been working with Atty. Shawn Arnold and the draft is ready to go to the District. To expedite things, we started doing their charters for them. Mr. Kidd hopes to get it to Joe De Pasquale this week and maybe we could get it knocked out pretty soon.

Odyssey Remodel: Hopefully, the 100% drawings on re-purposing will be ready to go to the State by the end of the month. We are working with the architect and he is frantically moving forward. We met with some of the career academy instructors today and will meet with the others, including ESE, later this week to avoid a holdup on our part. They still plan to compress the construction contract and have us in there in 2020. We need more money on the repurposing and Mr. Kidd is working on trying to get some. After we got into trying to collect the information on what we needed, to see what it would cost to put FFE in it (Furniture, Fixtures and Equipment), we decided that it would be impossible to get it now, but we do have next year to get some type of appropriation. We are also working on some other financing possibilities.

Prep Facility: We met with the building owner and the contractor that built the building. Mr. Kidd has a meeting with the contractor's representative on Monday to work through some issues. We did get to tour the building that Quantum High School is in and they still have a five-year lease with a couple of renewals. They want to stay there, but the good news is that they pay an exorbitant amount of rent. Mr. Kidd continued to describe the possibility of building on a second floor to the building to increase Prep to about 15,000 square feet to include a cafeteria and enough classrooms to get student population up to 750-800. Richard Moreno is working on the financing on it and it looks like we may qualify with the Walton Foundation bonding grant, 4-1/2%, 100% financing for 30 years. Mr. Kidd said these are some of the preliminaries and nothing is cast in stone without a Board Workshop for the Board to make a decision, and he is trying to get a package to bring to the Board.

Success Center: Mr. Kidd is trying to work out something with the District for the seven portables at the back of the campus. There is termite damage on some. He met with Wanda Paul after the School Board meeting and told her that if she, Jay and Mr. Kidd could get together without attorneys, they could possibly work something out. After they agree upon something, they could let the attorneys approve and legalize it. Perhaps we may meet next week to work on it.

Referendum Litigation: Mr. Kidd said he did not any other information on the Referendum Litigation, but that there is a bill floating around out there to amend one of the laws that is in place and there is a possibility it may correct the situation without litigation. Mr. Feldman said that the bill made it out of committee without any opposition from either party. It is looking good and the bill is written in past tense and has a July 1 implementation if it passes. If the District does not give that referendum money, it will come out of their FTE. The Governor will sign that bill.

8B. Deputy Superintendent's Report: Mr. Boggess said that we ended last session with three questions: What are we building. Palm Beach County's Premiere Career and Technical Education Center. Who are we building it with? The Community – anyone who wants to sit at this table and invest in what a vibrant Palm Beach County looks like. And lastly, what are we building it for? The future. We are building it for the next generation workforce, what the next generation in America looks like. When does this actually work? This is the followup piece for you today. It happens with three things and we have been talking with our leadership team about this, so that they talk with the teachers and they talk with their students, and the students talk with their parents and the community. Everyone works together for the common mission. We know what our mission is and we use it constantly, not only for guiding, but for our daily operations. We are creating a student that is ready for work, higher education and productive citizenship. It works when everyone is sacrificial in what they are doing. It is not for Jay Boggess or Dan Heller, Jim Notter, Eileen Turenne, or Nicole Handy, because there is no me in this; it is we. Lastly, everyone works purposefully. At this time of year, the staff will not hear Mr. Boggess talk about big picture concepts, but each one needs to be focused on doing their job. Josh Wiglesworth said it best – that this is a difficult time of the year, as it is busy with prom, celebration and graduation and teachers are exhausted and so are the students. The only way to make it happen is to do your job on a consistent basis. Mr. Boggess went through the four pieces of the Strategic Plan, and tell the Board what we have been doing to make sure and ensure that it is happening on a consistent basis.

• Continuous School Improvement:

O SkillsUSA – multiple gold, silver and bronze medals. When we are sending ten gold medalists to National Skills, something is going right on our campuses.

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- Loncey Elie is not only the Class Valedictorian and Skills Gold Medalist, but she started at SouthTech Prep and is a product of this System of Schools.
- o We received our Industry Certification funding for last year. We had a 98% graduation rate last year, one of the highest in Palm Beach County, while still serving over a 97% reduced lunch rate, and an 87% minority status at the high school. The data that came in today says that we are Number One when it comes to industry certification in Palm Beach County. We received \$477,000 for what we did last year. We beat schools that have 3600 students attending 2600, 2800, 2400, etc. We have around 1100. This is what Continuous School Improvement looks like.

• Program Expansion:

We are the closest that Palm Beach County has been to a real Secondary/Post-Secondary conversation with Palm Beach State College in over 20 years. We are slated to meet with the President, Dr. Ava Parker in the next two weeks to talk about Career Dual-Enrollment for our students, which is very similar to what the Atlantic Technical model in Broward County looks like, where you would Career-Dual-enroll and actually get college credits in your junior and senior year of high school. Mr. Boggess said he cannot think of a better branding/marketing technique than to say, why go to high school, when you can go to college? SouthTech's your place.

• Facilities Improvement/Growth:

o Mr. Kidd spoke about a variety of things going on with SouthTech Academy repurposing and SouthTech Prep. Ted Morse from the Ed Morse Corporation was on the campus and spent almost two hours touring the school. They will be donating various things totaling \$200,000 from Hunter Engineering Corporation. They have set up a meeting with Garmett, from whom we hope to get a paint booth for the new facility.

• Government Relations:

On May 23rd, because of the work that we have been doing legislatively, and lobbyist groups that have championed us, we have the K-12 Chancellor for DOE, Jacob Oliva and Andy Tuck, Vice Chairman of the State Board of Education, coming to SouthTech Academy. The reason for this is that when we were in Tallahassee, we met with 23 legislators and we have received word that the legislation that is being proposed this season is going to go through. What are the priorities? Choice and Career-Tech Education. What Jacob Oliva is already thinking about is that when Glades County or Bay or Jefferson County calls and tells them that the legislators have made this statute, but they do not have that in their counties, and do not know how to do any of it, they will be told that there is a poster child in SouthTech Schools, both in Choice and Career-Tech Ed, and we will show them everything. It all goes back to our three questions and it is about all of us. This is how you change the future and Mr. Boggess believes that Jacob Oliva and Andy Tuck are coming to SouthTech with that purpose.

He did ask the question, how to charter schools work together to support each other? Mr. Kidd briefly spoke of the charter school organization he was part of some years ago that tried to work together to support each other. He worked with it four or five years to breathe life into it, but it just did not work. Judge Martz said he had visited charter schools and find that they are much more involved with the students. He recognized SouthTech Academy as the best charter school in Palm Beach County. He has also come to our graduations for the past few years. This says something for this Board and for the staff.

RELIGIOUS EXPRESSION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Page 1 of 2

It is the policy of the SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc., a Florida Department of Education appointed Local Education Agency (LEA), that member schools (SouthTech Academy, SouthTech Preparatory Academy, and the SouthTech Success Center) will not discriminate against a student, parent, or school personnel on the basis of a religious viewpoint or religious expression.

Student Expression of Religious Viewpoints:

- 1. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA will treat a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject in the same manner that a school district treats a student's voluntary expression of a secular viewpoint.
- 2. A student may express his or her religious beliefs in coursework, artwork, and other written and oral assignments free from discrimination. A student's homework and classroom assignments shall be evaluated, regardless of their religious content, based on expected academic standards relating to the course curriculum and requirements.
- 3. A student may not be penalized or rewarded based on the religious content of his or her work if the coursework, artwork, or other written or oral assignments require a student's viewpoint to be expressed.

Religious Clothing, Jewelry, and Accessories:

A student may wear clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display a religious message or symbol in the same manner and to the same extent that secular types of clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display messages or symbols are permitted to be worn.

Students Engaging in Religious Activities and Expression at School:

- 1. A student may pray or engage in religious activities or religious expression before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student may engage in secular activities or expression.
- 2. A student may organize prayer groups, religion clubs, and other religious gatherings before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student is permitted to organize secular activities and groups.

Employees Engaging in Religious Activities and Expression at School:

- SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA may not prevent school personnel from
 participating in religious activities on school grounds that are initiated by students at
 reasonable times before or after the school day if such activities are voluntary and do
 not conflict with the responsibilities or assignments of such personnel.
- 2. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA must comply with the federal requirements in Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits an employer from discriminating against an employee on the basis of religion.

Equal Access to School Facilities:

South Tech Charter Academy, Inc. Board Policy 2.122

RELIGIOUS EXPRESSION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

1. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA shall give religious groups access to the same school facilities for assembling as given to secular groups without discrimination based on the religious content of the group's expression.

2. A group that meets for prayer or other religious speech may advertise or announce its meetings in the same manner and to the same extent that a secular group may advertise or announce its meetings.

Limited Public Forum Required for Student Speakers:

Per Section 1002.206, Florida Statutes, known as the "Florida Student and School Personnel Religious Liberties Act," SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA is required to establish a limited public forum for student speakers at any school event where a student is to speak publicly. Where student speakers are permitted, the district:

- 1. Must provide the forum in a manner that does not discriminate against a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject;
- 2. Must provide a method based on neutral criteria for the selection of student speakers at school events, activities, and graduation ceremonies;
- 3. Must ensure that a student speaker does not engage in obscene, vulgar, offensively lewd, or indecent speech; and
- 4. Must state in oral or written form that the student's speech does not reflect the endorsement, sponsorship, position, or expression of SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA must deliver this required disclaimer at all graduation events and at any other event where a student speaks publicly.
- 5. Student expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject may not be excluded from the limited public forum.

It is the policy of the [Insert County] School District that the district will not discriminate against a student, parent, or school personnel on the basis of a religious viewpoint or religious expression.

Religious Clothing, Jewelry, and Accessories

A student may wear clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display a religious message or symbol in the same manner and to the same extent that secular types of clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display messages or symbols are permitted to be worn.

Students Engaging in Religious Activities and Expression at School

- 1. A student may pray or engage in religious activities or religious expression before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student may engage in secular activities or expression.
- 2. A student may organize prayer groups, religion clubs, and other religious gatherings before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student is permitted to organize secular activities and groups.

- 3. Must ensure that a student speaker does not engage in obscene, vulgar, offensively lewd, or indecent speech; and
- 4. Must state in oral or written form that the student's speech does not reflect the endorsement, sponsorship, position, or expression of [Insert County] School District. [Insert County] School District must deliver this required disclaimer at all graduation events and at any other event where a student speaks publicly.
- 5. Student expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject may not be excluded from the limited public forum.



SB 436 Religious Expression in Public Schools (CH. 2017-074, Laws of Florida)

Bill Sponsor: Senator Baxley

Executive Summary:

This bill codifies much of the case law covering protected religious expression in public schools and prohibits discrimination against students, parents or personnel on the basis of religious expression. It also states that districts must comply with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits discrimination against an employee on the basis of religion.

The bill requires school districts to treat a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject the same as the district treats a secular viewpoint. While a religious viewpoint is to be permitted without discrimination where a student viewpoint is allowed to be expressed, the bill states that assignments are still to be evaluated within the academic standards related to the course curriculum at issue. The bill also requires districts to allow students to wear religious clothing, accessories and jewelry to the extent secular items with symbols or messages are also allowed.

The bill requires that students be allowed to pray or participate in religious activities or gatherings before, during and after school, to the same extent secular activities or clubs are allowed. Employees may not be prevented from participating in religious activities on school grounds initiated by students prior to or after the school day, provided these activities are voluntary and do not conflict with the employee's other assignments. The bill requires school districts to give religious groups the same access to school facilities and ability to announce or advertise meetings as given to secular groups.

Finally, the bill requires all school districts to adopt a policy creating a limited public forum for student speakers at school events where students speak publicly and cannot discriminate against voluntary religious expression by a student on an otherwise permissible subject. The district must provide neutral criteria for selection of speakers, must ensure the speaker does not engage in obscene or vulgar speech, and must state in oral or written form that the student's speech does not reflect endorsement of the school district. The Department of Education will be required to develop a model policy regarding the limited public forum and voluntary expression of religious viewpoints and by students and school personnel in public schools must publish the policy on the DOE website. Each district school board is required to adopt and implement the Department's model policy.



Section 1.

Creates new "Florida Student and School Personnel Religious Liberties Act.", to:

- Prohibit school district from discrimination against students, parents, or personnel on basis of religious views or expression.
- Require school districts to treat voluntary student expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject in the same manner the district treats a secular viewpoint.
- Allow students to express religious beliefs in coursework without discrimination, and prohibits
 reward or penalty based on religious content where the assignment requires student viewpoint to
 be expressed.
- Allow students to wear religious clothing, accessories and jewelry to the extent secular items with messages or symbols are allowed.
- Allow students to pray or participate in religious activities before, during and after school, including organization of religious clubs or gatherings, to the same extent secular activities or clubs are allowed.
- Employees may not be prevented from participating in religious activities in school grounds that are
 initiated by students at reasonable times prior to or after the school day, if such activities are
 voluntary and do not conflict with other assignments of such personnel.
- Require school districts to comply with Title II of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
- Require school districts to give religious groups the same access to same school facilities as given
 to secular groups, and requires the district to allow religious groups to advertise in the same
 manner and to the same extent as secular groups.
- Require school districts to adopt a policy that establishes a limited public forum for student speakers at school events where students speak publicly. The school district cannot discriminate against voluntary expression of a student's religious views on otherwise permissible subject, must provide neutral criteria for selection of student speakers, must ensure that the student speaker does not engage in obscene, vulgar, offensively lewd or indecent speech, and must state in oral or written form that the student's speech does not reflect endorsement or position of the school district.
- Require the Department of Education to develop a model policy regarding the limited public forum
 and voluntary expression of religious viewpoints and by students and school personnel in public
 schools pursuant to this section and shall publish the policy on the DOE website. Each district
 school board is required to adopt and implement the Department's model policy.

- Access
 - Preschool education (District administered)
 - All academic and extracurricular activities for which the student meets relevant eligibility criteria
- School of Origin
 - Now includes preschools (District administered), and a designated receiving school at the next grade level for a feeder school (elem. from Pre-K, middle from elem., high from middle)
 - District must presume remaining in the school of origin is in the student's best interest unless contrary to parent/guardian, or unaccompanied youth request, and consider student-centered factors when determining best interest
- Comparable Services
 - Counseling services for unaccompanied youth to prepare and improve readiness for post-secondary education
 - Appropriate credit for full or partial coursework completed at a prior school
- Dispute Resolution
 - Eligibility added as a reason for dispute
 - Student-centered best interest decision making
 - Student shall remain in the school of origin or shall be immediately enrolled in the eligible school in which enrollment is sought pending final resolution, including appeals
 - Student receives all services for which they are eligible until all disputes and appeals are resolved
- Homeless Liaison Duties
 - Now include coordination and collaboration with the State Coordinator for Homeless Education, as well as local social service, community agencies, and housing authorities

RELIGIOUS EXPRESSION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Page 1 of 2

It is the policy of the SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc., a Florida Department of Education appointed Local Education Agency (LEA), that member schools (SouthTech Academy, SouthTech Preparatory Academy, and the SouthTech Success Center) will not discriminate against a student, parent, or school personnel on the basis of a religious viewpoint or religious expression.

Student Expression of Religious Viewpoints:

- 1. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA will treat a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject in the same manner that a school district treats a student's voluntary expression of a secular viewpoint.
- 2. A student may express his or her religious beliefs in coursework, artwork, and other written and oral assignments free from discrimination. A student's homework and classroom assignments shall be evaluated, regardless of their religious content, based on expected academic standards relating to the course curriculum and requirements.
- 3. A student may not be penalized or rewarded based on the religious content of his or her work if the coursework, artwork, or other written or oral assignments require a student's viewpoint to be expressed.

Religious Clothing, Jewelry, and Accessories:

A student may wear clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display a religious message or symbol in the same manner and to the same extent that secular types of clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display messages or symbols are permitted to be worn.

Students Engaging in Religious Activities and Expression at School:

- 1. A student may pray or engage in religious activities or religious expression before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student may engage in secular activities or expression.
- 2. A student may organize prayer groups, religion clubs, and other religious gatherings before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student is permitted to organize secular activities and groups.

Employees Engaging in Religious Activities and Expression at School:

- SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA may not prevent school personnel from
 participating in religious activities on school grounds that are initiated by students at
 reasonable times before or after the school day if such activities are voluntary and do
 not conflict with the responsibilities or assignments of such personnel.
- 2. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA must comply with the federal requirements in Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits an employer from discriminating against an employee on the basis of religion.

Equal Access to School Facilities:

South Tech Charter Academy, Inc. Board Policy 2.122

RELIGIOUS EXPRESSION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

1. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA shall give religious groups access to the same school facilities for assembling as given to secular groups without discrimination based on the religious content of the group's expression.

2. A group that meets for prayer or other religious speech may advertise or announce its meetings in the same manner and to the same extent that a secular group may advertise or announce its meetings.

Limited Public Forum Required for Student Speakers:

Per Section 1002.206, Florida Statutes, known as the "Florida Student and School Personnel Religious Liberties Act," SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA is required to establish a limited public forum for student speakers at any school event where a student is to speak publicly. Where student speakers are permitted, the district:

- 1. Must provide the forum in a manner that does not discriminate against a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject;
- 2. Must provide a method based on neutral criteria for the selection of student speakers at school events, activities, and graduation ceremonies;
- 3. Must ensure that a student speaker does not engage in obscene, vulgar, offensively lewd, or indecent speech; and
- 4. Must state in oral or written form that the student's speech does not reflect the endorsement, sponsorship, position, or expression of SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA must deliver this required disclaimer at all graduation events and at any other event where a student speaks publicly.
- 5. Student expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject may not be excluded from the limited public forum.

FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION MODEL POLICY ON RELIGIOUS EXPRESSION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS¹

Per Section 1002.206, Florida Statutes, known as the "Florida Student and School Personnel Religious Liberties Act," the Department of Education's Model Policy on religious expression in public schools is as follows:

It is the policy of the [Insert County] School District that the district will not discriminate against a student, parent, or school personnel on the basis of a religious viewpoint or religious expression.

Student Expression of Religious Viewpoints

- 1. [Insert County] School District will treat a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject in the same manner that a school district treats a student's voluntary expression of a secular viewpoint.
- 2. A student may express his or her religious beliefs in coursework, artwork, and other written and oral assignments free from discrimination. A student's homework and classroom assignments shall be evaluated, regardless of their religious content, based on expected academic standards relating to the course curriculum and requirements.
- 3. A student may not be penalized or rewarded based on the religious content of his or her work if the coursework, artwork, or other written or oral assignments require a student's viewpoint to be expressed.

Religious Clothing, Jewelry, and Accessories

A student may wear clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display a religious message or symbol in the same manner and to the same extent that secular types of clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display messages or symbols are permitted to be worn.

Students Engaging in Religious Activities and Expression at School

- 1. A student may pray or engage in religious activities or religious expression before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student may engage in secular activities or expression.
- 2. A student may organize prayer groups, religion clubs, and other religious gatherings before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student is permitted to organize secular activities and groups.

- 1. Must provide the forum in a manner that does not discriminate against a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject;
- 2. Must provide a method based on neutral criteria for the selection of student speakers at school events, activities, and graduation ceremonies;
- 3. Must ensure that a student speaker does not engage in obscene, vulgar, offensively lewd, or indecent speech; and
- 4. Must state in oral or written form that the student's speech does not reflect the endorsement, sponsorship, position, or expression of [Insert County] School District. [Insert County] School District must deliver this required disclaimer at all graduation events and at any other event where a student speaks publicly.
- 5. Student expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject may not be excluded from the limited public forum.



SB 436 Religious Expression in Public Schools (CH. 2017-074, Laws of Florida)

Bill Sponsor: Senator Baxley

Executive Summary:

This bill codifies much of the case law covering protected religious expression in public schools and prohibits discrimination against students, parents or personnel on the basis of religious expression. It also states that districts must comply with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits discrimination against an employee on the basis of religion.

The bill requires school districts to treat a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject the same as the district treats a secular viewpoint. While a religious viewpoint is to be permitted without discrimination where a student viewpoint is allowed to be expressed, the bill states that assignments are still to be evaluated within the academic standards related to the course curriculum at issue. The bill also requires districts to allow students to wear religious clothing, accessories and jewelry to the extent secular items with symbols or messages are also allowed.

The bill requires that students be allowed to pray or participate in religious activities or gatherings before, during and after school, to the same extent secular activities or clubs are allowed. Employees may not be prevented from participating in religious activities on school grounds initiated by students prior to or after the school day, provided these activities are voluntary and do not conflict with the employee's other assignments. The bill requires school districts to give religious groups the same access to school facilities and ability to announce or advertise meetings as given to secular groups.

Finally, the bill requires all school districts to adopt a policy creating a limited public forum for student speakers at school events where students speak publicly and cannot discriminate against voluntary religious expression by a student on an otherwise permissible subject. The district must provide neutral criteria for selection of speakers, must ensure the speaker does not engage in obscene or vulgar speech, and must state in oral or written form that the student's speech does not reflect endorsement of the school district. The Department of Education will be required to develop a model policy regarding the limited public forum and voluntary expression of religious viewpoints and by students and school personnel in public schools must publish the policy on the DOE website. Each district school board is required to adopt and implement the Department's model policy.



Section 1.

Creates new "Florida Student and School Personnel Religious Liberties Act.", to:

- Prohibit school district from discrimination against students, parents, or personnel on basis of religious views or expression.
- Require school districts to treat voluntary student expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject in the same manner the district treats a secular viewpoint.
- Allow students to express religious beliefs in coursework without discrimination, and prohibits reward or penalty based on religious content where the assignment requires student viewpoint to be expressed.
- Allow students to wear religious clothing, accessories and jewelry to the extent secular items with messages or symbols are allowed.
- Allow students to pray or participate in religious activities before, during and after school, including organization of religious clubs or gatherings, to the same extent secular activities or clubs are allowed.
- Employees may not be prevented from participating in religious activities in school grounds that are
 initiated by students at reasonable times prior to or after the school day, if such activities are
 voluntary and do not conflict with other assignments of such personnel.
- Require school districts to comply with Title II of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
- Require school districts to give religious groups the same access to same school facilities as given
 to secular groups, and requires the district to allow religious groups to advertise in the same
 manner and to the same extent as secular groups.
- Require school districts to adopt a policy that establishes a limited public forum for student speakers at school events where students speak publicly. The school district cannot discriminate against voluntary expression of a student's religious views on otherwise permissible subject, must provide neutral criteria for selection of student speakers, must ensure that the student speaker does not engage in obscene, vulgar, offensively lewd or indecent speech, and must state in oral or written form that the student's speech does not reflect endorsement or position of the school district.
- Require the Department of Education to develop a model policy regarding the limited public forum
 and voluntary expression of religious viewpoints and by students and school personnel in public
 schools pursuant to this section and shall publish the policy on the DOE website. Each district
 school board is required to adopt and implement the Department's model policy.

- Access
 - Preschool education (District administered)
 - All academic and extracurricular activities for which the student meets relevant eligibility criteria
- School of Origin
 - Now includes preschools (District administered), and a designated receiving school at the next grade level for a feeder school (elem. from Pre-K, middle from elem., high from middle)
 - District must presume remaining in the school of origin is in the student's best interest unless contrary to parent/guardian, or unaccompanied youth request, and consider student-centered factors when determining best interest
- Comparable Services
 - Counseling services for unaccompanied youth to prepare and improve readiness for post-secondary education
 - Appropriate credit for full or partial coursework completed at a prior school
- Dispute Resolution
 - Eligibility added as a reason for dispute
 - Student-centered best interest decision making
 - Student shall remain in the school of origin or shall be immediately enrolled in the eligible school in which enrollment is sought pending final resolution, including appeals
 - Student receives all services for which they are eligible until all disputes and appeals are resolved
- Homeless Liaison Duties
 - Now include coordination and collaboration with the State Coordinator for Homeless Education, as well as local social service, community agencies, and housing authorities

SB 436 Religious Expression in Public Schools (CH. 2017-074, Laws of Florida)

Bill Sponsor: Senator Baxley

Effective Date: July 1, 2017

Executive Summary:

This bill codifies much of the case law covering protected religious expression in public schools and prohibits discrimination against students, parents or personnel on the basis of religious expression. It also states that districts must comply with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits discrimination against an employee on the basis of religion.

The bill requires school districts to treat a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject the same as the district treats a secular viewpoint. While a religious viewpoint is to be permitted without discrimination where a student viewpoint is allowed to be expressed, the bill states that assignments are still to be evaluated within the academic standards related to the course curriculum at issue. The bill also requires districts to allow students to wear religious clothing, accessories and jewelry to the extent secular items with symbols or messages are also allowed.

The bill requires that students be allowed to pray or participate in religious activities or gatherings before, during and after school, to the same extent secular activities or clubs are allowed. Employees may not be prevented from participating in religious activities on school grounds initiated by students prior to or after the school day, provided these activities are voluntary and do not conflict with the employee's other assignments. The bill requires school districts to give religious groups the same access to school facilities and ability to announce or advertise meetings as given to secular groups.

Finally, the bill requires all school districts to adopt a policy creating a limited public forum for student speakers at school events where students speak publicly and cannot discriminate against voluntary religious expression by a student on an otherwise permissible subject. The district must provide neutral criteria for selection of speakers, must ensure the speaker does not engage in obscene or vulgar speech, and must state in oral or written form that the student's speech does not reflect endorsement of the school district. The Department of Education will be required to develop a model policy regarding the limited public forum and voluntary expression of religious viewpoints and by students and school personnel in public schools must publish the policy on the DOE website. Each district school board is required to adopt and implement the Department's model policy.



Section 1.

Creates new "Florida Student and School Personnel Religious Liberties Act.", to:

- Prohibit school district from discrimination against students, parents, or personnel on basis of religious views or expression.
- Require school districts to treat voluntary student expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject in the same manner the district treats a secular viewpoint.
- Allow students to express religious beliefs in coursework without discrimination, and prohibits reward or penalty based on religious content where the assignment requires student viewpoint to be expressed.
- Allow students to wear religious clothing, accessories and jewelry to the extent secular items with messages or symbols are allowed.
- Allow students to pray or participate in religious activities before, during and after school, including organization of religious clubs or gatherings, to the same extent secular activities or clubs are allowed.
- Employees may not be prevented from participating in religious activities in school grounds that are
 initiated by students at reasonable times prior to or after the school day, if such activities are
 voluntary and do not conflict with other assignments of such personnel.
- Require school districts to comply with Title II of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
- Require school districts to give religious groups the same access to same school facilities as given
 to secular groups, and requires the district to allow religious groups to advertise in the same
 manner and to the same extent as secular groups.
- Require school districts to adopt a policy that establishes a limited public forum for student speakers at school events where students speak publicly. The school district cannot discriminate against voluntary expression of a student's religious views on otherwise permissible subject, must provide neutral criteria for selection of student speakers, must ensure that the student speaker does not engage in obscene, vulgar, offensively lewd or indecent speech, and must state in oral or written form that the student's speech does not reflect endorsement or position of the school district.
- Require the Department of Education to develop a model policy regarding the limited public forum
 and voluntary expression of religious viewpoints and by students and school personnel in public
 schools pursuant to this section and shall publish the policy on the DOE website. Each district
 school board is required to adopt and implement the Department's model policy.

It is the policy of the SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc., a Florida Department of Education appointed Local Education Agency (LEA), that member schools (SouthTech Academy, SouthTech Preparatory Academy, and the SouthTech Success Center) will not discriminate against a student, parent, or school personnel on the basis of a religious viewpoint or religious expression.

Student Expression of Religious Viewpoints:

- 1. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA will treat a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject in the same manner that a school district treats a student's voluntary expression of a secular viewpoint.
- 2. A student may express his or her religious beliefs in coursework, artwork, and other written and oral assignments free from discrimination. A student's homework and classroom assignments shall be evaluated, regardless of their religious content, based on expected academic standards relating to the course curriculum and requirements.
- 3. A student may not be penalized or rewarded based on the religious content of his or her work if the coursework, artwork, or other written or oral assignments require a student's viewpoint to be expressed.

Religious Clothing, Jewelry, and Accessories:

A student may wear clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display a religious message or symbol in the same manner and to the same extent that secular types of clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display messages or symbols are permitted to be worn.

Students Engaging in Religious Activities and Expression at School:

- 1. A student may pray or engage in religious activities or religious expression before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student may engage in secular activities or expression.
- 2. A student may organize prayer groups, religion clubs, and other religious gatherings before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student is permitted to organize secular activities and groups.

Employees Engaging in Religious Activities and Expression at School:

- 1. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA may not prevent school personnel from participating in religious activities on school grounds that are initiated by students at reasonable times before or after the school day if such activities are voluntary and do not conflict with the responsibilities or assignments of such personnel.
- 2. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA must comply with the federal requirements in Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits an employer from discriminating against an employee on the basis of religion.

Equal Access to School Facilities:

South Tech Charter Academy, Inc. Board Policy 2.122

RELIGIOUS EXPRESSION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

1. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA shall give religious groups access to the same school facilities for assembling as given to secular groups without discrimination based on the religious content of the group's expression.

2. A group that meets for prayer or other religious speech may advertise or announce its meetings in the same manner and to the same extent that a secular group may advertise or announce its meetings.

Limited Public Forum Required for Student Speakers:

Per Section 1002.206, Florida Statutes, known as the "Florida Student and School Personnel Religious Liberties Act," SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA is required to establish a limited public forum for student speakers at any school event where a student is to speak publicly. Where student speakers are permitted, the district:

- 1. Must provide the forum in a manner that does not discriminate against a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject;
- 2. Must provide a method based on neutral criteria for the selection of student speakers at school events, activities, and graduation ceremonies;
- 3. Must ensure that a student speaker does not engage in obscene, vulgar, offensively lewd, or indecent speech; and
- 4. 4. Must state in oral or written form that the student's speech does not reflect the endorsement, sponsorship, position, or expression of SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA. SouthTech Charter Academy, Inc. LEA must deliver this required disclaimer at all graduation events and at any other event where a student speaks publicly.
- 5. Student expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject may not be excluded from the limited public forum.

FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION MODEL POLICY ON RELIGIOUS EXPRESSION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS¹

Per Section 1002.206, Florida Statutes, known as the "Florida Student and School Personnel Religious Liberties Act," the Department of Education's Model Policy on religious expression in public schools is as follows:

It is the policy of the [Insert County] School District that the district will not discriminate against a student, parent, or school personnel on the basis of a religious viewpoint or religious expression.

Student Expression of Religious Viewpoints

- 1. [Insert County] School District will treat a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject in the same manner that a school district treats a student's voluntary expression of a secular viewpoint.

Religious Clothing, Jewelry, and Accessories

A student may wear clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display a religious message or symbol in the same manner and to the same extent that secular types of clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display messages or symbols are permitted to be worn.

Students Engaging in Religious Activities and Expression at School

- 1. A student may pray or engage in religious activities or religious expression before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student may engage in secular activities or expression.
- 2. A student may organize prayer groups, religion clubs, and other religious gatherings before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that a student is permitted to organize secular activities and groups.

Summary Information:

The School Board approved the STSC application and included language for the Success Center to be incubated on the current SouthTech campus, under the same arrangements as SouthTech Preparatory Academy in 2013. The current sponsor's administration refuses to honor the previous arrangement and insists on a leasing fee being charged. Time constraints prevent a legal challenge of their position, as work must be done on some of the portables to prepare them for student occupancy in three months. The Superintendent has successfully negotiated a reduction in leasing fees from \$10/square foot to \$5/square foot. Realistically, our only option to open the Success Center in August is to accept the terms of the lease and move forward.

LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE made and entered into, by and between THE SCHOOL BOARD OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, a corporate body politic, existing under the laws of the State of Florida (the "School Board") and SOUTH TECH SUCCESS CENTER, INC., a Charter School as defined by Florida charter school law and a Florida non-profit corporation ("Tenant").

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, School Board, in its capacity as Sponsor, and Tenant are parties to the current Charter Contract (the "Charter School Contract"), which governs Tenant's operation as a charter school in Palm Beach County, Florida, (School Board and Tenant are collectively referred to as the "Parties");

WHEREAS, the School Board is the owner of certain real property situated in Palm Beach County, Florida, at 1300 S.W. 30th Ave., Boynton Beach, FL 33426 and known as South Tech Charter Academy, which property is depicted in Exhibit "A" attached hereto (hereinafter "the School"); and

WHEREAS, Tenant has requested a lease to occupy, as more particularly described in this Lease, a portion of the School property depicted and identified in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, consisting of 7 portable units, for Tenant's use for charter school purposes.

WITNESSETH:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the rental reserved herein, the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

Article I. BASIC LEASE PROVISIONS

Section 1.01 Terms and Conditions. The School Board hereby grants to Tenant the right to and shall be permitted to utilize the Leased Premises as improved with the portables identified as 50-9813, 50-9814, 99-122, 99-251, 99-330, 99-765 and 99-1338 and depicted on Exhibit "A" (the "Portables"), pursuant to the terms, conditions and provisions of this Lease for the purposes of operating a charter school (the "Leased Premises"). Tenant shall be responsible for working out shared parking arrangements with South Tech Charter Academy.

Section 1.02 Length of Term and Commencement Date. The term of this Lease shall commence July 1, 2019 (the "Commencement Date") and expire on June 30, 2020, (the "Term"), unless sooner terminated pursuant to the provisions

of this Lease at the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease, Tenant shall be responsible for all moving costs associated with Tenant's occupancy of the Leased Premises. Tenant's acknowledgment and covenant is a material inducement to the School Board entering into this Lease.

Section 1.03 Extension of Term. Tenant acknowledges that the School Board intends to demolish the Portables upon the expiration of the Term as part of the redevelopment of the Leased Premises. Tenant further acknowledges that it has no expectation that any extension of the Term will be granted and Tenant covenants not to seek payment or reimbursement from the School Board for any costs or expenses incurred as a result of the School Board not approving an extension request, including but not limited to moving costs. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event that the School Board's time line for redevelopment of the Leased Premises is delayed, the Term may be extended if both Parties agree, subject to negotiation of the rental fee for the additional time period.

Section 1.04 Acceptance by Tenant. Tenant certifies that Tenant has inspected the Leased Premises and accepts same "As Is," in its existing condition, as of the Commencement Date of this Lease, together with all defects, latent or patent, if any, and subject to all easements, encumbrances and restrictions and matters of record. Tenant further acknowledges the School Board has made no warranties or representations of any nature whatsoever regarding Leased Premises including, without limitation, any relating to the physical condition thereof or of any improvements located therein, or the suitability of the Leased Premises for Tenant's intended use thereof.

Article II. RENT

Section 2.01 Annual Rent. In consideration of this Lease, Tenant shall pay to School Board and School Board agrees to accept, during the Term, at such place as the School Board shall from time to time direct by notice to Tenant, rent at the following rates and times ("Annual Rent"). Annual Rent during the Term shall be payable in full in advance not later than the Commencement Date in the total amount of Thirty-three thousand six hundred Dollars, (\$33,600). The annual rent calculation is for seven portables, with a total area of 6,720 square feet, times \$5.00 per square foot.

Section 2.02 Additional Rent. Any and all sums of money or charges required to be paid by Tenant under this Lease other than the Annual Rent shall be considered "Additional Rent," whether or not the same is specifically so designated and School Board shall have the same rights to enforce due and timely payment by Tenant of all Additional Rent as are available to School Board relating to the Annual Rent.

Section 2.03 Triple Net. This Lease shall be totally net (i.e. "triple net") to the School Board. In addition to the Annual Rent stated above, Tenant shall

promptly pay all charges for gas, water, sewer, waste removal, dumpster charges, contractual services, cable TV, electricity, telephone, internet and all other services, utilities or commodities used in connection with the Leased Premises during the Lease Term, as well as any fines charged in connection with Tenant's use of the Leased Premises whether or not the cost thereof be a charge or imposition against the Leased Premises. Tenant shall be responsible for allocation of utility costs between South Tech Charter Academy and South Tech Success Center. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, in no event shall School Board be liable for any interruption of power or other utility service to the Leased Premises. If any such charges are not paid when due, School Board may pay the same, and any amount so paid by School Board shall thereupon become due to School Board from Tenant with interest at the highest rate allowed by law, upon demand, as Additional Rent.

Section 2.04 Accord and Satisfaction. In the event Tenant pays any amount that is less than the amount stipulated to be paid under this Lease, such payment shall be considered to be made only on account of the stipulated amount. No endorsement or statement on any check or letter shall be deemed an accord and satisfaction. School Board may accept any check or payment without prejudice to School Board's right to recover the balance due or to pursue any other remedy available to School Board pursuant to this Lease or under the law.

Section 2.05 Late Payment. A late fee in the amount of Two hundred eighty Dollars (\$280.00) shall be assessed if the Annual Rent payment is not received by School Board on or before the tenth day after the Commencement Date and each anniversary thereof.

Section 2.06 Security Deposit. Tenant shall not be required to provide a Security Deposit for Leased Premises.

Section 2.07 **Taxes.** In addition to all other amounts payable under this Lease, Tenant shall pay all applicable taxes assessed by any governmental authority against the Annual Rent and/or Additional Rent, the Leased Premises or Tenant's personal property attributable to this Lease, even if the applicable statute or ordinance may propose to impose such tax against School Board. School Board and Tenant further agree that if at any time during the term of this Lease, the present method of taxation or assessment of real estate shall be changed so that the whole or any part of the real estate taxes, assessment or governmental impositions now levied, assessed or imposed on the Leased Premises shall, in lieu thereof, be assessed, levied, or imposed wholly or in part, as a capital levy or otherwise upon the rents reserved herein or any part thereof, or as a tax, corporation franchise tax, assessment, levy or charge, or any part thereof, measured by or based, in whole or in part, upon the Leased Premises or on the rents derived therefrom and imposed upon the School Board, then Tenant shall pay all such taxes, assessments, levies, impositions, or charges. Nothing contained in this Lease shall require Tenant to pay a corporate franchise, gross receipts, transfer or income tax of the School Board, nor shall any of the same be deemed real estate taxes as defined herein unless the same be imposed in lieu of the real estate taxes.

Article III. IMPROVEMENTS AND ALTERATIONS TO LEASED PREMISES

Section 3.01 Alterations. Following the Commencement Date, Tenant shall not at any time construct or make any improvements, additions, modifications or alterations ("Alterations") to the Leased Premises without the prior written consent of the Chief Operating Officer. If Tenant desires to have Alterations made to the Leased Premises, Tenant shall submit to the COO conceptual plans and specifications for such proposed Alterations and identify Tenant's funding source and Tenant's budget for the proposed Alterations. Subject to COO approval of such Alterations and the Parties mutual agreement as to the respective responsibilities for maintenance and repair of such Alterations, School Board staff shall prepare and submit detailed plans to the COO and Tenant for approval. The construction of all Alterations shall be performed using the School Board's construction contracting procedures and overseen by School Board personnel or contractors in the same way that alterations are made to School Board-operated facilities. All Alterations shall be deemed a part of the Leased Premises. School Board shall have the right, but not the obligation, to make Alterations at School Board's expense, in its sole discretion. Tenant agrees and acknowledges that all work performed to the Leased Premises, whether pursuant to this Section or otherwise, shall be performed and accomplished solely for the benefit of Tenant, and not for the benefit of School Board, such work being nevertheless subject to each and every provision of this Lease. All work done by Tenant shall be done in a good and workmanlike manner and shall be diligently prosecuted to completion strictly in accordance with the approved plans and specifications therefor. Upon giving its approval for any work or Alterations, the COO may specify whether the Alteration is to be removed by Tenant, at Tenant's sole cost and expense, upon the termination or expiration of this Lease. Should Tenant desire to replace any of the portable classrooms, Tenant's representative, shall submit a replacement request to School Board, which request the COO may approve or deny in its reasonable discretion. Tenant's request for replacement of the portable classrooms shall include the plans and specifications for the proposed replacement portable classrooms. Tenant shall comply with all applicable governmental regulations regarding removal and installation of portable Tenant shall ensure that all improvements are constructed to completion in accordance with the approved plans therefor and that all persons or entities performing work or providing materials relating to such improvements including, without limitation, all contractors, subcontractors, sub-subcontractors, laborers, materialmen, suppliers and professionals, are paid in full for such services and materials. Tenant shall also require contractors to furnish satisfactory evidence of statutory Worker's Compensation insurance, commercial general liability insurance, commercial automobile insurance, and physical damage insurance on a Builder's Risk form with the interest of School Board endorsed as

an additional insured thereon, in such amounts and in such manner as School Board may reasonably require. School Board may require additional insurance for any alterations or improvements approved hereunder, in such amount as School Board reasonable determines to be necessary.

Section 3.02 Exterior Signs. Tenant shall have the right, at its sole risk and expense and in conformity with applicable laws and ordinances, to erect and thereafter, to repair or replace, if it shall so erect signs on any portion of the Leased Premises, providing that Tenant shall, at School Board's option, remove any such signs upon termination of this Lease, and repair all damage occasioned thereby to the Leased Premises.

Section 3.03 Ownership of Improvements, Fixtures and Personal **Property.** All right, title and interest in and to the improvements and appurtenances thereto constructed by Tenant and fixtures attached thereto, at the option of School Board, shall automatically vest in School Board upon the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease. Tenant shall, at its sole cost and expense, execute and deliver a bill of sale for the improvements, appurtenances and fixtures, conveying all of Tenant's interest in same to School Board, prior to the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease. Notwithstanding the foregoing, School Board, at its sole option, may direct Tenant to remove at Tenant's sole cost and expense, any or all of, the improvements, appurtenances and fixtures upon the expiration or termination of this Lease. If Tenant is required to remove some or all of the improvements, appurtenances and fixtures, Tenant shall restore the Leased Premises to the condition that existed prior to the construction of the improvements, appurtenances and fixtures, using materials of like kind and quality. All personal property, furnishings and removable equipment of Tenant, susceptible of being removed from the improvements and appurtenances without damage to the improvements and appurtenances, shall remain the property of Tenant and Tenant shall be required to remove the same or any part thereof at the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease, and Tenant, at its sole cost and expense, shall make any repairs occasioned by such removal.

Article IV. CONDUCT OF BUSINESS AND USE OF BY CHARTER SCHOOL TENANT

Section 4.01 Use. Tenant shall exercise the rights granted hereunder solely and exclusively for operation of a charter school pursuant to the Charter School Contract, as amended from time to time. Tenant shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws, codes, rules and regulations in performing its duties, responsibilities and obligations pursuant to this Lease. Tenant shall not use, or suffer the use of the Leased Premises for any other use, business, or purpose other than those specifically permitted hereby, except with prior written consent of School Board's Superintendent.

Section 4.02 Waste or Nuisance. Tenant shall not commit or suffer to be

committed any waste upon or within the School or Leased Premises, commit or permit the maintenance or commission of any nuisance or other act which results in damage to the School or which may affect School Board's fee interest in the Leased Premises or results in an unsightly condition. Tenant shall cause any and all trash or discarded materials, including but not limited to construction materials used and/or generated by Tenant, to be removed from the School and Leased Premises at Tenant's sole cost and expense immediately.

Section 4.03 Governmental Regulations. Tenant shall, at Tenant's sole cost and expense, comply with all ordinances, laws, statutes and regulations promulgated thereunder of all School Board, municipal, state, federal and other applicable governmental authorities, now in force or which may hereafter be in force, pertaining to Tenant's use of the Leased Premises. Tenant shall indemnify, defend and save School Board harmless from any and all penalties, fines, costs, expenses, suits, claims, or damages resulting from Tenant's failure to perform its obligations in this Section.

Section 4.04 Non-Discrimination. Tenant shall assure and certify that it will comply with Title IV of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, and School Board's Policy No. 7.081, and shall not discriminate against any individual on the basis of race, gender, gender identity or expression, religion, national origin, ethnicity, sexual orientation, age, or disability with respect to any activity occurring under this Lease. Tenant understands and agrees that violation of this clause is a material breach of this Lease and may result in termination of the Lease and/or the Charter School Agreement, or other sanctions.

Surrender. Prior to the Expiration Date or earlier termination Section 4.05 of this Lease, Tenant, at its sole cost and expense shall remove Tenant's personal property and removable equipment from the Leased Premises and shall repair any physical damage caused by the removal of the same, using materials of like kind and quality, reasonable wear and tear excepted. Not later than the Expiration Date, Tenant shall yield up peaceably to School Board the Leased Premises and all improvements and fixtures in good order, repair and condition in all respects; excepting only reasonable wear and tear. Upon termination or expiration of this Lease, Tenant shall vacate and surrender the Leased Premises and return all School Board Personal Property to the School Board and the parties shall be relieved of all further obligations arising subsequent to the date of such termination or expiration. In the event Tenant shall holdover, refuse or fail to vacate and relinquish possession of the Leased Premises at the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease, Tenant shall be liable to pay to School Board during the entire period of such holdover, the maximum rent, as provided for in §83.06, Florida Statutes, as amended from time to time. Such holdover occupancy shall not be deemed to extend or renew the Lease Term, but such occupancy shall continue as a tenancy at will, from month to month, upon the covenants, provisions and conditions herein contained. The Annual Rent shall be the rental in effect during the last year of this Lease as extended or renewed, prorated and payable

for the period of such occupancy.

- **Section 4.06 Hazardous Substance.** For purposes hereof, "Hazardous Materials" shall mean any hazardous or toxic substance, material, waste of any kind, petroleum product or byproduct, contaminant or pollutant as defined or regulated by Environmental Laws. "Environmental Laws" shall mean any applicable federal, state or local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations or other governmental restrictions. "Disposal" shall mean the release, storage, use, handling, discharge or disposal of such Hazardous Materials.
- (a) Tenant shall not use, maintain, store or dispose of any Hazardous Materials, chemicals or other agents used or produced in Tenant's operations, at the Leased Premises, in any manner not permitted by Environmental Laws. Furthermore, Tenant shall not cause or permit the disposal of Hazardous Materials upon the School or Leased Premises or upon adjacent lands and shall operate and occupy the Leased Premises in compliance with all Environmental Laws.
- (b) Any disposal of a Hazardous Material, whether by Tenant or any third party associated with Tenant, shall be reported to School Board immediately upon the knowledge thereof by Tenant. Tenant shall be solely responsible for the entire cost of remediation and cleanup of any Hazardous Materials disposed of or discovered upon the School or the Leased Premises, or emanating from the Leased Premises, or onto adjacent lands, as a result of Tenant's, or Tenant's agents, contractors or employees exercise of the rights granted by this Lease.
- (c) Tenant hereby agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless School Board from and against any and all claims, suits, judgments, loss, damage, fines or liability which may be incurred by School Board, including reasonable attorney's fees and costs at trial and on appeal, which may arise directly, indirectly or proximately as a result of any violation of Environmental Laws or the disposal of any Hazardous Materials by Tenant, or Tenant's agents, contractors or employees. Tenant's responsibility hereunder shall continue and apply to any violation hereof, whether the same is discovered during the term hereof or otherwise. While this provision establishes contractual liability of Tenant, it shall not be deemed to alter or diminish any statutory or common law liability of Tenant.
- (d) Tenant acknowledges that School Board would not have entered into this Lease without the indemnification contained herein and acknowledges the receipt and sufficiency of separate good and valuable consideration for such indemnification. This provision shall survive the expiration or termination of this Lease.

Article V. REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

Section 5.01 Responsibility of School Board. Five of the Portables are not currently habitable for student use, and are scheduled for demolition when

South Tech Academy vacates the campus and moves to the former Odyssey Middle School campus. The School Board shall, at the Tenant's sole cost and expense, make repairs to the Portables such as the roof, structural, electrical, HVAC and plumbing, to render the Portables habitable, prior to the start of the 2019-2020 school year. Repairs to the building systems of the Portables required to maintain habitability for the duration of the Term of this Lease shall be performed by the School Board, at the Tenant's sole cost and expense. School Board's Chief Operating Officer shall be the final arbiter of all decisions regarding the necessity of repairs to maintain habitability of the Portables.

Section 5.02 Responsibility of Tenant. Tenant shall reimburse the School Board as Additional Rent for the cost of repairs to make the Portables habitable and maintain habitability for the duration of the Term of this Lease within fifteen (15) days of receipt of School Board's invoice. Tenant shall maintain Leased Premises in a clean condition, free of refuse, trash, and rubbish, at Tenant's sole cost and expense. Tenant has the right to hire subcontractors to perform these tasks, including but not limited to custodial and landscape/lawn maintenance services. Tenant shall be responsible, at its sole cost and expense, for maintenance and replacement of building contents owned by Tenant, including but not limited to furniture, computers, software, and other equipment that is not part of the building structure, except as noted in Section 5.01. Tenant shall be responsible, at its sole cost and expense, for normal building maintenance costs. including, but not limited to, custodial cleaning and replacement of all consumable items such as light bulbs, cleaning supplies and bathroom supplies.

Section 5.03 School Board's Right to Inspect. School Board or School Board's agents shall have the right to inspect the Leased Premises. School Board shall conduct such inspections in a manner that does not unreasonably interfere with or disrupt Tenant's operations.

Article VI. INSURANCE

Section 6.01 In addition to all insurance provisions contained in the Charter School Contract, Tenant shall obtain and maintain in full force and effect throughout the Term the following insurance coverages Tenant shall provide the Certificates(s) of Insurance for required coverage within seven (7) days of the date of request by School Board, but in any respect at least thirty (30) days prior to the commencement of any Term. The actual insurance policy must be included with the Certificate of Insurance.

(a) WORKERS' COMPENSATION: Tenant must comply with Section 440, Florida Statutes, Workers' Compensation and Employees' Liability Insurance with minimum statutory limits or elective exemptions as defined in Florida Statute 440

will be considered on a case by case basis.

Required Endorsements:

- Waiver of Subrogation WC 0003 13 or its equivalent
- (b) COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY: Tenant shall procure and maintain, for the life of the contract, Commercial General Liability Insurance. This policy shall provide coverage for death, bodily injury, personal injury, products and completed operations liability and property damage that could arise directly or indirectly from the performance of the contract. It must be an occurrence form policy. THE SCHOOL BOARD OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA SHALL BE NAMED AS AN ADDITIONAL INSURED ON THE CERTIFICATE FOR COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE.

The minimum limits of coverage shall be \$1,000,000 per occurrence, Combined, Single Limit for Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability.

Required Endorsements:

 \circ Additional Insured – CG 20 26 or CG 20 10 and CG 20 37 or their equivalents.

Note: CG 20 10 or CG 2026 must be accompanied by CG 20 37 to include products/completed operations.

- Waiver of Transfer Rights of Recovery CG 24 04 or its equivalent.
- Primary and noncontributory CG 2001 or its equivalent.

Note: If blanket endorsements are being submitted, please include the entire endorsement and applicable policy number.

(c) BUSINESS AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY: Tenant shall procure and maintain, for the life of the contract, Business Automobile Liability Insurance. In the event Tenant does not own vehicles, the Tenant shall maintain coverage for Hired and Non-Owned Auto Liability, which may be satisfied by way of endorsement to the Commercial General Liability policy of separate Business Auto Liability policy. THE SCHOOL BOARD OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA SHALL BE NAMED AS AN ADDITIONAL INSURED ON THE CERTIFICATE FOR BUSINESS AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY INSURANCE.

The minimum limits of coverage shall be \$1,000,000 per occurrence, Combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability. This coverage shall be an "Any Auto" form policy. The insurance must be an occurrence form policy.

Article VII. INDEMNIFICIATION OF THE PARTIES

Section 7.01 **Indemnification.** In addition to all indemnification provisions contained in the Charter School Contract, Tenant shall, in addition to any other obligation to indemnify the School Board, and to the fullest extent permitted by law, protect defend, indemnify and hold harmless the School Board, their agents, officers, elected officials and employees from and against any and all claims, suits, actions, liabilities, losses (including economic losses), and costs arising during the Lease Term or any renewal hereof for any actual or alleged bodily injury, sickness, disease or death and/or damage to property, including the loss of use resulting there from, or any other damage or loss arising out of, or claimed to have resulted from any actual or alleged act or omission of Tenant, or anyone directly or indirectly employed by Tenant, sustained in or about the Leased Premises or access and utility easement area, by reason or as a result of the use and occupancy of the Leased Premises or any access or utility easement area by Tenant, its agents, employees, and contractors, and from and against any orders, judgments, and/or decrees which may be entered thereon, and from and against all costs, attorney's fees at trial and on appeal, expenses and liabilities incurred in and about the defense of any such claim. In the event School Board shall be made a party to any litigation commenced against Tenant as a result of Tenant's use of the Leased Premises, or by Tenant against any third party relating to Tenant's use of the Leased Premises, then Tenant shall indemnify, defend, and hold School Board harmless and pay all costs and attorney's fees incurred by School Board in connection with such litigation, and any appeals thereof. The indemnification obligations hereunder shall not be limited to any limitation on the amount, type of damages, compensation or benefits payable by or for Tenant under workers' compensation acts; disability benefits acts, other employee benefit acts or any statutory bar. Any costs or expenses, including attorney's fees, incurred by the School Board to enforce this agreement shall be borne by Tenant. Tenant recognizes the broad nature of this indemnification and hold harmless clause and voluntarily makes this covenant and expressly acknowledges the receipt of good and valuable consideration provided by the School Board in support hereof according to the laws of the State of Florida. This Article shall survive the termination of this Lease. Whether the cause of any damage, loss, or liability is insurable, insured or not insured, foreseen or unforeseen, neither party hereto nor its representatives, agents contractors, subcontractors, invitees or licensees shall in any event be liable to the other party or its representatives, agents, contractors, subcontractors, invitees or licensees for claims for anticipatory profits, consequential, incidental, exemplary, punitive, or any indirect damages of any nature arising at any time, from any cause whatsoever, whether arising in tort, contract, warranty, strict liability, by operation of law, or otherwise, even if by such party, its representatives', agents', contractors', subcontractors', invitees' or licensees' negligence or fault, connected with or resulting from performance or non-performance under this Lease or as a result of the construction, maintenance, operation or use of the Leased Premises by either party.

Article VIII. DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION

Section 8.01 Casualty. In the event the Leased Premises is destroyed or so damaged or injured by fire or other casualty during the Term of this Lease, whereby the same is rendered untenable, in whole or in part, School Board may, at its sole option, elect not to restore or repair the Leased Premises but to terminate this Lease. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, in the event of damage by fire or other casualty that cannot reasonably be expected to be repaired within thirty (30) days following same or, if the Leased Premises is damaged by fire or other casualty so that such damage may reasonably be expected to disrupt Tenant's operations for more than thirty (30) days, then Tenant may at any time following such fire or other casualty terminate this Lease upon fifteen (15) days written notice to School Board. In the event School Board elects to terminate this Lease, Tenant shall vacate and surrender the Leased Premises as required hereby, whereupon the parties shall be relieved of all further obligations hereunder arising after the date of such termination. The termination herein mentioned shall be evidenced in writing. Termination of this Lease shall not affect Tenant's obligations under this Lease arising prior to such termination. Termination of the Lease under this Article may not result in an automatic termination of the Charter In the event that the School Board elects to terminate this Lease pursuant to this Article, the School Board and Tenant shall cooperate in good faith in an attempt to identify a suitable replacement facility owned by the School Board to which Tenant may relocate.

Section 8.02 Damage to Leased Premises Caused by Tenant. If any action or inaction of Tenant, its officers, employees, agents, students, invitees or any other third party during the Term results in damage to the Leased Premises, Tenant shall upon demand reimburse School Board for the cost incurred by School Board in repairing or replacing the damaged property, using materials of like kind or quality.

Article IX. ASSIGNMENT AND SUBLETTING

Section 9.01 Tenant may not assign, mortgage, pledge, collaterally assign, or encumber this Lease, in whole or in part, or School Board's Personal Property nor, in compliance with Section 4.01, sublet, sublease or rent all or any portion of the Leased Premises nor grant any easements or enter into any management agreements affecting the Leased Premises, without prior written consent of School Board, which may be granted or withheld at School Board's sole and absolute discretion. This provision shall be construed to include a prohibition against any assignment, mortgage, pledge, encumbrance, or sublease, by operation of law, legal process, receivership, bankruptcy, or otherwise, whether voluntary or involuntary. Any attempt to assign, transfer, encumber, sublease or license any interest in this Lease shall be null and void and grounds for immediate termination by School Board.

Article X. UTILITIES

Section 10.01 Tenant shall be responsible for all of the utility fees directly

related to Tenant(s)'s operations on the Leased Premises such as water, sewer, garbage removal, electricity, landline phone, internet connectivity, and IT security monitoring during the Term of this Lease.

Article XI. ACCESS

Section 11.01 Tenant shall comply with any reasonable security procedures established by School Board to prevent unauthorized access to the Leased Premises and School generally. Tenant and School Board shall each designate emergency contact personnel to notify in case of an emergency requiring access to the Leased Premises.

Article XII. DEFAULT

Default by Tenant. The occurrence of any one or more of Section 12.01 the following shall constitute an Event of Default by Tenant under this Lease: (i) Tenant's failure to pay any sum due hereunder within thirty (30) days after demand for said payment; (ii) Tenant's failure to perform or observe any other term, covenant, or condition of this Lease on Tenant's part to be performed hereunder and such failure continues for a period of more than thirty (30) days after the date Tenant receives written notice from School Board notifying Tenant of the specific failure; provided, however, Tenant shall have such extended period as may be required beyond the thirty (30) days if the nature of the cure is such that it reasonably requires more than thirty (30) days and Tenant commences the cure within the thirty (30) day period and thereafter continuously and diligently pursues the cure to completion within sixty (60) days; (iii) Tenant's leasehold estate being taken by execution, attachment or process of law or being subjected to any bankruptcy proceeding; or (iv) termination of the Charter School Contract. If any Event of Default occurs, then at any time thereafter while the Event of Default continues, School Board shall have the right to pursue such remedies as may be available to School Board under the law, including, without limitation, the right to give Tenant notice that School Board intends to terminate this Lease upon a specified date not less than three (3) days after the date notice is received by Tenant, in which event this Lease shall then expire on the date specified as if that date had been originally fixed as the expiration date of the Term of this Lease. If, however, the default is cured within the three (3) day period and the School Board is so notified, this Lease will continue.

Section 12.02 Default by School Board. School Board shall not be in default unless School Board fails to perform obligations required of School Board within a reasonable time, but in no event later than thirty (30) days after written notice by Tenant to School Board, specifying wherein School Board has failed to perform such obligations; provided, however, that if the nature of School Board's obligations is such that more than thirty (30) days are required for performance then School Board shall not be in default if School Board commences performance within such thirty (30) day period and thereafter diligently pursues the same to

completion.

Article XIII. TERMINATION

Section 13.01 This Lease shall automatically terminate in the event that the Charter School Contract expires or is otherwise terminated.

Section 13.02 School Board may terminate this Lease if Tenant defaults under the terms of this Lease and such default is not remedied within the applicable cure period set forth in Article XII.

Section 13.03 Tenant reserves the right to terminate this Lease prior to expiration of the Term, or any extension thereof, by providing the School Board with one-hundred twenty (120) days prior written notice to the School Board. Upon termination of the Lease, Tenant shall surrender the Leased Premises to School Board as set forth in Section 4.05. Tenant covenants that it will not seek payment or reimbursement from the School Board for any costs and expenses incurred as a result of Tenant's terminating this Lease early, including but not limited to moving costs. Furthermore, Tenant hereby acknowledges and agrees that such termination of this Lease by Tenant shall hereby terminate any future obligations of the School Board as Sponsor of the Charter School to provide them with a facility under the terms of the Charter School Contract. The Improvements shall be surrendered by Tenant to School Board upon the expiration or earlier termination.

Article XIV. QUIET ENJOYMENT

Section 14.01 Upon the observance and performance of all the covenants, terms and conditions on Tenant's part to be observed and performed, Tenant shall peaceably and quietly hold and enjoy the rights granted hereunder for the Term hereby demised without hindrance or interruption by School Board or any other person or persons lawfully or equitably claiming by, through or under the School Board, subject, nevertheless, to the terms and conditions of this Lease.

Article XV. CONDEMNATION

Section 15.01 If the Leased Premises or any part thereof shall be taken, appropriated or condemned by exercise of the power of eminent domain, or conveyed or transferred pursuant to an agreement in lieu of condemnation, School Board shall be entitled to the entire award therefore, including, without limitation, any award relating to both Tenant's leasehold estate and School Board's reversionary interest in the fee simple estate, without deduction, claim or setoff for any present or future estate of Tenant. Tenant hereby assigns and relinquishes to School Board all right, title and interest in such award and, upon request, shall execute all documents required to evidence such result. In the event of a total taking of the Leased Premises, this Lease shall terminate upon the date title vests in the condemning authority. Notwithstanding such termination, Tenant shall

remain liable for all matters arising under this Lease prior to such termination. School Board shall have no obligation to restore the Leased Premises or improvements or otherwise perform any work upon same as a result of any such taking.

Section 15.02 In the event of condemnation of the Leased Premises or any portion thereof, and, if such condemnation may reasonably be expected to disrupt Tenant's operations at the Leased Premises for more than thirty (30) days, Tenant may terminate this Lease upon fifteen (15) days written notice to School Board. Any such notice of termination shall cause this Lease to expire with the same force and effect as though the date set forth in such notice were the date originally set as the expiration date of this Lease and the parties shall make an appropriate adjustment as of such termination date with respect to payments due to the other under this Lease. Termination of this Lease based on "condemnation" shall not affect Tenant's obligations under this Lease arising prior to such termination.

Section 15.03 In the event of condemnation of the Leased Premises or any portion thereof, and, if such condemnation may reasonably be expected to permanently disrupt Tenant's operations at the Leased Premises, the School Board and Tenant shall cooperate in good faith in an attempt to identify a suitable replacement facility owned by the School Board to which Tenant may relocate

Article XVI. MISCELLANEOUS

Section 16.01 Entire Agreement. The terms, conditions and provisions of the current Charter School Contract are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein. This Lease and any Exhibits attached hereto and forming a part hereof, as if fully set forth herein, along with the current Charter School Contract constitute all agreements, conditions and understandings between School Board and Tenant. To the extent that there is a conflict between any term, condition or provision of this Lease and the current Charter School Contract, this Lease shall govern unless specifically provided otherwise. All representations, either oral or written, shall be deemed to be merged into this Lease. Except as herein otherwise provided, no subsequent alteration, waiver, change or addition to this Lease shall be binding upon School Board or Tenant unless reduced to writing and signed by them. Defined terms not defined in this Lease shall have the same meaning as set forth in the Charter School Contract.

Section 16.02 Notices. All notices, consents, approvals, demands and elections (collectively, "notices") to be given or delivered by or to any party hereunder shall be in writing and shall be (as elected by the party giving such notice) hand delivered by messenger, courier service, or national overnight delivery service (provided in each case a receipt is obtained), or alternatively shall be sent by United States Certified Mail, with Return-Receipt Requested. The effective date of any notice shall be the date of delivery of the notice if by personal delivery, courier services, or national overnight delivery service, or if mailed, upon

the date which the return receipt is signed or delivery is refused or the notice designated by the postal authorities as non-deliverable, as the case may be.

(b) Any party may from time to time change the address to which notice under this Lease shall be given such party, upon three (3) days prior written notice to the other parties.

Section 16.03 Severability. If any term of this Lease or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Lease, or the application of such term to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby, and each term of this Lease shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Section 16.04 Broker's Commission. Tenant represents and warrant that

Tenant has not dealt with any real estate salesperson, agent, finder or broker in connection with this Lease and agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless School Board from and against any claims or demands of any such salesperson, agent, finder or broker claiming to have dealt with Tenant. The foregoing indemnification shall include all costs, expenses and fees, including reasonable attorney's fees at trial and all appellate levels, expended or incurred in the defense of any such claim or demand.

Section 16.05 Wavier. The waiver by either party of any default of any term, condition or covenant herein contained shall not be a waiver of such term, condition or covenant, or any subsequent default of the same or any other term, condition or covenant herein contained. The consent or approval by School Board to or of any act by Tenant requiring School Board's consent or approval shall not be deemed to waive or render unnecessary School Board's consent to or approval of any subsequent similar act by Tenant. No waiver of any provision of this Lease shall be effective against any party hereto unless it is in writing and signed by the party(s) waiving such provision. A written waiver shall only be effective as to the specific instance for which it is obtained and shall not be deemed a continuing or future waiver.

Section 16.06 Waiver of Jury Trial. THE PARTIES HERETO WAIVE TRIAL BY JURY IN CONNECTION WITH PROCEEDINGS OR COUNTERCLAIMS, BROUGHT BY EITHER OF THE PARTIES HERETO AGAINST THE OTHER, IN CONNECTION WITH THIS LEASE.

Section 16.07 Governing Law. This Lease shall be governed by and interpreted according to the laws of the State of Florida. Venue shall be exclusively in a State court of competent jurisdiction in Palm Beach County, Florida.

Section 16.08 Radon. Radon is a naturally occurring radioactive gas that, when it has accumulated in a building in sufficient quantities, may present health risks to persons who are exposed to it over time. Levels of radon that exceed federal and state guidelines have been found in buildings in Florida. Additional information regarding radon and radon testing may be obtained from School Board's public health unit.

Section 16.09 Time of the Essence. Time is of the essence with respect to the performance of every provision of this Lease in which time of performance is a factor.

Section 16.10 Non-exclusivity of Remedies. No remedy herein conferred upon any party is intended to be exclusive of any other remedy, and each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given hereunder or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute or otherwise. No single or partial exercise by any party of any right, power,

or remedy hereunder shall preclude any other or further exercise thereof.

Section 16.11 Construction. No party shall be considered the author of this Lease since the parties hereto have participated in extensive negotiations and drafting and redrafting of this document to arrive at a final agreement. Thus, the terms of this Lease shall not be strictly construed against one party as opposed to the other party based upon who drafted it. In the event that any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or provision hereof is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such shall not affect the remaining portions of this Lease and the same shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 16.12 Effective Date of Agreement. This Lease is expressly contingent upon the approval of the School Board, and shall become effective only when signed by Tenant and duly authorized representatives of the School Board.

Section 16.13 Force Majeure. Any party delayed by a Force Majeure Event, as defined herein, in performing under this Lease shall use reasonable efforts to remedy the cause or causes of such Force Majeure Event. A delay due to a Force Majeure Event shall serve to toll the time to perform under this Lease. "Force Majeure Event" shall mean any act of God, fire, flood, earthquake, explosion, riot, sabotage, windstorm, failure of utility service, or labor dispute.

Section 16.14 **No Liens.** School Board's interest in the Leased Premises and School Board's Personal Property shall not be subject to liens arising from Tenant's use of the Leased Premises and School Board's Personal Property, or exercise of the rights granted hereunder. Tenant shall notify any and all parties or entities performing work or providing materials relating to any improvements made by Tenant of this provision of this Lease. If so requested by School Board, Tenant shall file a notice satisfactory to School Board in the Public Records of Palm Beach County, Florida stating that School Board's interest shall not be subject to liens for improvements made by Tenant. Tenant shall within ten (10) days of receipt of notice cause any lien imposed against the Leased Premises or School Board's Personal Property to be discharged or transferred to bond. In the event that Tenant fails to satisfy or transfer such claim within said 10-day period, School Board may do so and thereafter charge Tenant, and Tenant shall promptly pay to School Board upon demand, as Additional Rent, all costs incurred by School Board in connection with the satisfaction or transfer of such claim, including attorney's fees. Further, Tenant agrees to indemnify, defend, and save School Board harmless from and against any damage or loss incurred by School Board as a result of any such construction lien.

Section 16.15 Binding Effect. This Lease shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of, the parties hereto and their respective legal representatives, successors and assigns.

Section 16.16 Recording. Neither this Lease, nor any memorandum or

short form hereof, shall be recorded in the Public Records of Palm Beach County, Florida.

Section 16.17 Headings. The paragraph headings or captions appearing in this Lease are for convenience only, are not part of this Lease, and are not to be considered in interpreting this Lease.

Section 16.18 Amendment. This Lease may be modified and amended only by written instrument executed by the parties hereto.

Section 16.19 Incorporation by Reference. Exhibits attached hereto and referenced herein shall be deemed to be incorporated in this Lease by reference.

Section 16.20 Public Entity Crimes. As provided in Florida Statutes 287.132-133, Tenant hereby certifies that, to its knowledge, neither it, nor its affiliates, agents, contractors, employees, or suppliers who will perform work under this Lease have been placed on the convicted vendor list maintained by the State of Florida Department of Management Services within thirty-six (36) month period immediately preceding the Commencement Date of the Term of this Lease. This certificate is required pursuant to Florida Statute 287.133(3)(a).

Section 16.21 Personal Tenant Property. Personal property of Tenant located or stored on the Leased Premises shall be at the sole risk of Tenant and Tenant acknowledges and agrees that School Board shall have no liability to Tenant for loss or damage sustained under any legal theory. Tenant shall be responsible for insuring Tenant's personal property together with School Board's Personal Property, at Tenant's sole cost and expense. School Board agrees and acknowledges the personal property of Tenant stored within the Leased Premises shall remain the property of Tenant, and, upon expiration or earlier termination of this Lease, shall be removed by Tenant.

Section 16.22 No Agency. Except as otherwise provided, neither Party shall be deemed or construed by the other Party nor by any third party to be a principal and agent of the other Party or for a relationship of partnership or of a joint venture between the Parties hereto, it being understood and agreed that neither any provision contained herein, nor any acts of the Parties hereto, shall be deemed to create any relationship between the Parties hereto other than the relationship of School Board and Tenant.

Section 16.23 No Third Party Beneficiaries. The parties expressly acknowledge that it is not their intent to create or confer any rights or obligations in or upon any third person or entity under this Lease. None of the parties intend to directly or substantially benefit a third party by this Lease. The parties agree that there are no third party beneficiaries to this Lease and that no third party shall be entitled to assert a claim against any of the parties based upon this Lease. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by School Board to be sued by third

parties in any matter arising out of this Lease.

Section 16.24 Counterparts. This Lease may be executed in any number of counterpart copies, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute a single instrument.

Section 16.25 Records. Each party shall maintain its own respective records and documents associated with this Lease in accordance with the records retention requirements applicable to public records. Each party shall be responsible for compliance with any public documents request served upon it pursuant to Section 119.07, Florida Statutes, and any resultant award of attorney's fees for non-compliance with that law.

Section 16.26 Survival. Provisions contained in this Lease that, by their sense and context, are intended to survive the suspension or termination of this Lease, shall so survive.

Section 16.27 Inspector General. Tenant agrees and understands that the School Board's Office of Inspector General ("Inspector General") shall have immediate, complete and unrestricted access to all papers, books, records, documents, information, personnel, processes (including meetings), data, computer hard drives, emails, instant messages, facilities or other assets owned, borrowed or used by Tenant with regard to this Lease. Tenant's employees, vendors, officers and agents shall furnish the Inspector General with requested information and records within their custody for the purposes of conducting an investigation or audit, as well as provide reasonable assistance to the Inspector General in locating assets and obtaining records and documents as needed for investigation or audit relating to this Lease. Furthermore, Tenant understands, acknowledges and agrees to abide by School Board Policy 1.092.

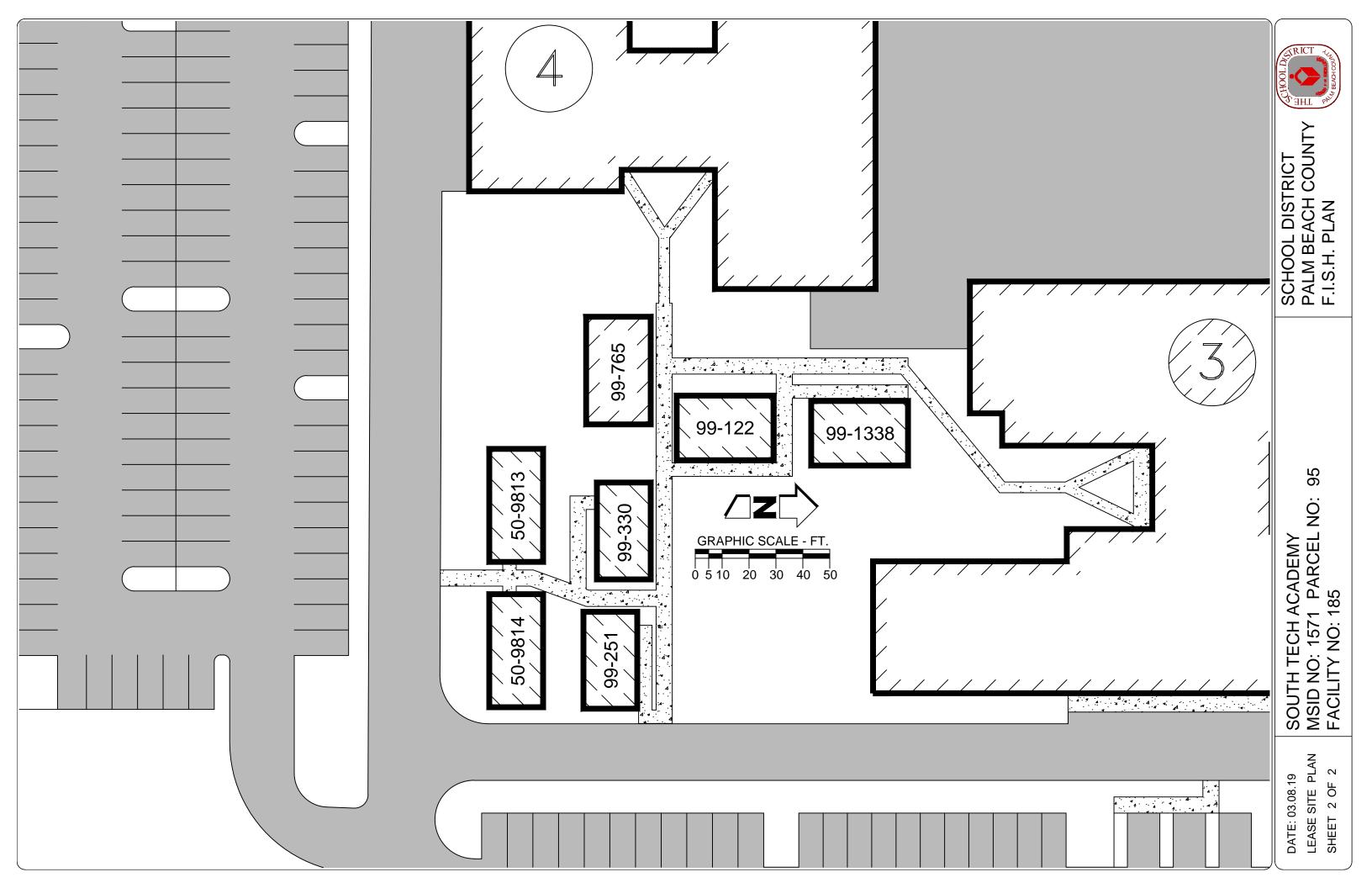

Policy 5.74 - Students Experiencing Homelessness is being revised to comply with amendments made to the McKinney-Vento Act. Key changes include:

- Access
 - Preschool education (District administered)
 - All academic and extracurricular activities for which the student meets relevant eligibility criteria
- School of Origin
 - Now includes preschools (District administered), and a designated receiving school at the next grade level for a feeder school (elem. from Pre-K, middle from elem., high from middle)
 - District must presume remaining in the school of origin is in the student's best interest unless contrary to parent/guardian, or unaccompanied youth request, and consider student-centered factors when determining best interest
- Comparable Services
 - Counseling services for unaccompanied youth to prepare and improve readiness for post-secondary education
 - Appropriate credit for full or partial coursework completed at a prior school
- Dispute Resolution
 - Eligibility added as a reason for dispute
 - Student-centered best interest decision making
 - Student shall remain in the school of origin or shall be immediately enrolled in the eligible school in which enrollment is sought pending final resolution, including appeals
 - Student receives all services for which they are eligible until all disputes and appeals are resolved
- Homeless Liaison Duties
 - Now include coordination and collaboration with the State Coordinator for Homeless Education, as well as local social service, community agencies, and housing authorities
